All positions will pay prevailing wages prescribed by the Service Contract Act (includes an hourly base wage in addition to a cash stipend in lieu of benefits). Training and certification will be provided for all positions. The **Phoenix Paper Data Capture Center** is on the bus line and also offers free and secure parking.
